She liaised with a wide variety of health care professionals both internally and externally, gaining invaluable experience of multi-disciplinary team working.

In her first qualified OT role, Shauna was employed by a private company based in Manchester, to provide OT focus groups across a range of schools within the West End of Newcastle upon Tyne. As a newly qualified OT, this challenged her to work autonomously and develop confidence in her clinical reasoning, without the face-to-face support of a day-to-day MDT. Shauna built excellent professional relationships with her students and was able to provide a lot of coaching and modelling of OT strategies within classrooms. She also delivered a range of training within such schools, focusing on enabling teaching staff to further support and develop handwriting skills for students.

#### 2015 – 2016 Support Worker, Tees/Tyne House, Percy Hedley Foundation

In order to gain experience working with children with SEN, Shauna took a part time role as a support worker, working across both the children's and young adult's homes within the Percy Hedley Foundation. This afforded her the opportunity to work closely with children with complex needs and integrate her skills as a newly qualified OT to better support their activities of daily living.

### 2015 Personal Assistant, Disability North

Having just qualified with her degree in OT, Shauna was keen to gain experience working in the care sector whilst awaiting a paediatric OT role to be advertised in the North East. She worked for a short time as a carer for a young woman with Cerebral Palsy, providing daytime care and overnight support, helping the young woman with her activities of daily living such as self-care and community access. This experience allowed Shauna to gain useful insight into how to support people with disabilities to live a meaningful life.
